The Meeting commenced at 7.45pm

50. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The reasons for Councillors Bulley, Parsons, Read, Thomason absences were accepted, together with apologies from Ward Councillor Brown.

51. CHAIRMANS ANNOUNCEMENTS

- a. Civic Service Invitation No-one able to attend so Clerk to send apologies.
- b. The Chairman wished to address the issue as why the meeting was not being held in the interim village hall and requested that Cllr Foskett update Council with the current situation. Cllr Foskett reported that the installation / build of the interim village hall was completed on time. On their first visit to site CBC Building Control identified issues with the access ramp and main entrance door / fire door. Croudace completed the works requested. On their second visit to site CBC Building Control identified issues with the toilet soil pipes and signage regarding building capacity. Croudace have also completed these works and are now waiting for CBC Building Control re-inspection and appropriate certification so that the interim village hall can open to the public. A further note was made regarding the installation of the electricity meter to the building which is still pending. Until it is installed the interim village hall will be powered by a generator and the path used to bring cables to the building will not be tarmacked after installation.

53. MINUTES

a. Moved Cllr Merryweather/Seconded Cllr Thompson. Resolved that the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council help on Monday, 24th July 2017 are an accurate record of the proceeding and that they be signed by the Chairman. Carried unanimously

At this point (8.00pm) the Chairman suspended Standing Orders to receive reports from our Ward Councillors and to allow members of the public to address the Council in relation to items on the agenda or request matters to be discussed at a subsequent meeting.

Ward Councillor Mark Liddiard advised the meeting that:

- Consultation on the draft Local Plan had now closed with 15000 responses and 1000 in last 2 hours. Responses will now be taken into consideration and a second consultation will happen in early 2018. Responses from the second consultation will then be submitted with the plan to the Planning Inspector. The Clerk was requested to send a copy of the Parish Councils response to our Ward Councillors.
- A new way of reporting Highways issues will be released shortly

- School place choices to be returned by 31st October 2017.
- Samuel Whitbread achieved 3rd best results in county for GCSE results and was 1st for A level results.
- Compensation claim made by Hawthorne Leisure for reduction in value of the Sugar Loaf ph still pending.

Parishioners made the following comments and asked the following questions:

- Can Cllr Liddiard lobby CBC Highways to address safety issues on the A507 Shefford by-pass between the Airman and Esso roundabouts (in particular the approach to the Esso roundabout from both directions on the A507), especially in the light of the recent fatality?
- Can Cllr Liddiard lobby CBC Highways regarding pedestrian / cycle safety concerns when crossing the A507 by-pass between Shefford and Meppershall?
- Can the Parish Council ensure that the nesting hedge at the rear of 1A Shefford Road is not removed or cut down?
- What is happening regarding speeding issues on Shefford Road?
- Issue raised regarding number of homes CBC quoted as required in Draft Local Plan. A potential 55000 new homes would saturate the county and we do not have the infrastructure to cope with them. The county is being asked to absorb 30% more housing per 1000 population compared to Bedford Borough.
- Is there a health and safety issues with the pre-school currently using the old village hall and construction traffic passing by?
- Should the village hall development site have a banksman assisting vehicles entering site at all times?
- Contractor demolishing the Methodist church and factory seems to have flouted health and safety requirements (debris on footpath and road, lighting bonfires, noise etc). What can be done to resolve?

c. HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORT

- i. Cllr Smith R reported the following:
 - Shefford Road closures between 18-22 September. Diversions via Esso roundabout
 → Stondon → Shillington → Rectory Road → High Street.
 - RMF scheme yellow lines painted but not as per diagram that was issued with public consultation. CBC are in dialogue with contractor to rectify.
 - Fildyke Close plant growth causing visibility / safety issues at its junction with Fildyke Road. Possibly signage required but the /close is un-adopted.
 Moved Cllr Chapman/Seconded Cllr Smith R. Resolved that the Clerk request clarification from CBC Highways regarding overgrown vegetation in Fildyke Road on either side of the Fildyke Close junction, and that consideration be given to

appropriate signage in Fildyke Road on the approaches to that and the Lyspitt Close junctions (staggered junction/slow sign).

Carried unanimously

- CBC have started Gully cleaning but not yet arrived in Meppershall. Requested that the Clerk ask for notification of when the vehicles/machinery will be in Meppershall and that this information be circulated to parishioners.
- Information provided on new road and rail schemes.
- Sign near St Marys Church/Rectory Road is the wrong way around. Requested that the Clerk ask CBC Highways to fix.
- ii. Request for information on which roads are prioritised during extreme weather Moved Cllr Smith R/Seconded Cllr Chapman. Resolved that response is as per the 2016/17 gritting programme.

Carried unanimously

- iii. Hoo Road road safety Bridleway is a Public Highway maintained at public expense. CBC is in discussion with Anglian Water regarding their claimed access right and are investigating the speed limit and signage possibilities. Clerk to provide update at next meeting
- iv. Shared ownership of speed cameras Deferred to next meeting.
- v. Presence of PCSO's at parish meetings Councillors expressed disappointment at the recent communications from our PCSO's and their non-availability to attend council meetings and assist with speeding enforcement at the school following the new speed restrictions.

Moved Cllr Thompson/ Seconded Cllr Smith P. Resolved that the Clerk write to Inspector Nicholas Masters (nicholas.masters@befordshire.pnn.police.uk), who is the Neighbourhood Policing lead for Shefford, Stotfold and Arlesey, regarding the speeding and parking issues in the village and request PCSO support in the community. *Carried unanimously*

d. ENVIRONMENT AND LEISURE

- i. Cllr Merryweather reported the following:
 - New cantilever swing has been installed at Old Road Meadow but requires a post installation inspection report and the Clerk is dealing with the issue of rust on the frame. The Clerk will also be required to arrange a quarterly inspection.
 - Goal posts for Old Road Meadow are in progress
 - There seems to be issues with the performance and quality of the grass cutting. Requested that the Clerk discuss issues with the contractor.
- ii. **CBC Leisure Strategy and Parish Schedule Update** Decided that the Environment and Leisure Working Group meet to draw up a proposal to present to council.

e. HEALTH & SAFETY and RISK MANAGEMENT

 Cllr Chapman has completed the assessment and will provide a full report at the next meeting. Result of Financial Risk Assessment to be formally adopted by full Council to be deferred to next meeting.

i. The Clerk reported on behalf of Cllr Thomason that no meetings have taken place in the last month but that progress has been made in assembling the reference material. Pace is expected to pick up over the coming months.
